Bremont Manual-Wind Chronograph Wristwatch.

The Bremont manual-wind chronograph is a refined example of mid-20th century Swiss watchmaking, representing the era of smaller "boutique" brands that combined high-quality components with understated design. Produced in Switzerland, this piece reflects a time when companies focused on precision and reliability, often using the same movements found in far more widely recognised names.

This watch features a classic bicompass chronograph layout, with two subdials set against a clean, silver-toned dial. Applied hour markers and Arabic numerals at 12 and 6 give it a balanced, highly legible appearance, while the outer tachymeter and telemeter scales add both functionality and vintage character. The hands and markers are filled with tritium, consistent with watches of this period, and have aged naturally over time, adding to its authenticity and charm.

Housed in a 36mm stainless steel case, the watch retains its original crown and exhibits the slim, elegant proportions typical of 1960s chronographs. It is powered by a manual-wind chronograph movement, Valjoux 7733 - known for its durability and ease of servicing. The chronograph function is in full working order, making it not only collectible but also practical for regular wear.

The watch is presented on a leather strap and features a stainless steel case back stamped "Stainless Steel Back - 1155," further confirming its period construction. Overall, this Bremont chronograph offers a compelling combination of vintage aesthetics, reliable mechanics, and the understated appeal of a lesser-known Swiss maker, making it an excellent choice for collectors and enthusiasts alike.
