Description

A good Snaffles WWI military print 'Indian Cavalry (B.E.F.)', 'Yi - hai!' Snaffles hand coloured lithograph. The main picture shows a Cavalryman tent pegging surrounded by five remarques in the margin. The remarques depicted are of a Cavalryman holding his lance aloft, a couple of head shots of an Indian soldier, an Indian with full back pack and with a spade over one shoulder and an Indian squatting on the ground sharpening his lance.

Charles 'Snaffles' Johnson Payne (1884 - 1967) was an English painter who specialised in water colours, and who's subject matter was invariably equestrian (racing, hunting, polo and pig sticking), military or a combination of these. Snaffles had a very distinctive style by showing just one person in detail, in addition he added remarques and amusing captions to supplement the pictures and main title.
