The picture shows two monks, one about to putt whilst his companion is seen praying, looking on is a well-attired gentleman and his caddie. In the bottom right hand corner can be found the verse "A feature in ye game, played on ye linkes atte, Ayr between a lord of, CULZEAN and a monk, of CROSSRAGUEL for, hys nose". The picture was published by Golf Illustrated Ltd, 33 Temple Chambers, Temple Avenue, London E.C, 1904.

Charles 'Chas' Crombie (1885 - 1967) was an illustrator whose work is well known to the collector. His pictures can be found in many forms, on postcards, calendars, in books and on Royal Doulton ceramics.
